Regatta Feedback-General discussion

Current setup, regatta is under control of president and host school Worcester->Lowell->Cape was not good, should not happen again Brett commended for pulling off regatta on three days notice

• Trying to hold regattas with purview of all town and local officials in the future

General Feedback

- Looking for paid regatta director, to professionalize regatta
 - Accountability and compensation
 - Stay on top of all deadlines etc
 - Single point person to make decisions
- Do we need to pay regatta workers and not depend on host school and volunteers? Amassing the resources is difficult for any host.
 - Relying on volunteer, launches, man power from all teams. It doesn't always come through. How do we make it a predictable success?
 - Problems arise when we change location at the last minute
 - Shouldn't have to bring launches and give volunteers at the last minute

- single regatta director can organize beforehand and if needed professionalize (pay for) additional resources
 - can identify what needs to be paid for and make sure all teams are contributing
- need to analyze other regatta sites and see what's available
- need to train and bring in parent volunteers to help with regattas
 - \circ $\,$ from teams that are able to provide them
- each organization needs to provide volunteers to be on the regatta committee (months in advance)
 - need to expand base of operation outside of head coaches
- Club Nationals and NEIRA outsource running of the regatta to other organizations to avoid splitting resources
- Committee would work with host team
- Parents have stakeholder buy in, will commit to run good, safe regatta
- Several meetings prior to regatta to organize
- MPSRA can entirely host regatta, provide all volunteers, rent all equipment OR we can outsource it
 - Hybrid does not always work
- This will be a work in progress over the next 2-3 years
- Worcester will be available for fall states through bridge construction, Middlesex Construction has guaranteed a lane
- Canadian Henley, Saratoga, NH Champs, QRA run good regattas with combination of pros and volunteers
- Dale Wickenheiser proposes asking the board to look into and price outsourcing and hiring a regatta director
 - Seconded by Ed McCormack
- Board has set a meeting for February 7 to explore options for running regattas and start work on bylaws, insurance, and host sites

• Was to be tabled for 2 years, but has changed to 1 year Glenn Merry has been playing organizations/regions against each other to get buy in
